**2025/2026**

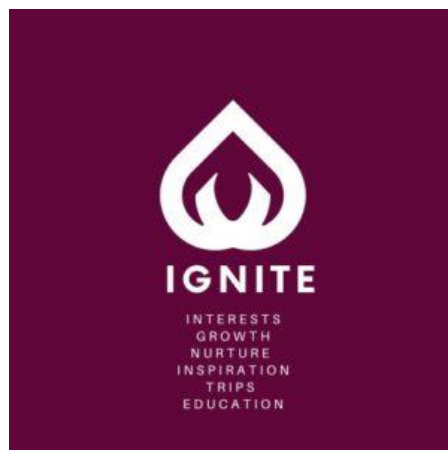
